

Sixteen-year-old sisters Samira and Rima aren't exactly living the dream. Nope. Instead, they live with their maddeningly unreliable mother in a rundown trailer. Dad's dead, money's tight, and Mom disappears for days at a time. So when Sam's grandfather wills her the family valuables—a little cache of Lebanese antiquities sent to Glen Arbor by way of Beirut—she's desperate enough to try pawning them before Mom can.

But she shouldn't. Because one is the cursed, forbidden, burial coin of a forgotten god. Disturbing it condemns her and Rima to the Phoenician underworld, a place of wicked cities, burning cedar forests, poisoned feasts of milk and lemons, and an endless, windless ocean. Nothing is what it seems. No one is who they say. And down here, night never ends.

To get home—and keep her sister safe—Sam will have to outwit beautiful shapeshifters, pose as a royal bride, sail the darkest sea... and maybe kill the god of death himself.





But when their Uncle Bram murders their father in a bid for the crown, the girls are forced onto the run, along with lowly Dev the Bearkeeper and the Lourdes's half-grown grizzly Alcor, symbol of their house. As a bitter struggle for the throne consumes the kingdom in civil war, the sisters must rely on Dev, the bear cub, and each other to survive—and find wells of courage, cunning, and skill they never knew they had.

This is the first of two BEAR HOUSE books signed up, with an option for more. These are commercial books with tons of kid appeal, a richly imagined setting, and nonstop, adrenaline-soaked adventure.
