

# 2013 ILLUSTRATORS EXHIBITION

The **ILLUSTRATORS EXHIBITION**, the heart of the **CHILDREN'S BOOK FAIR** since 1967, when it debuted at the 4<sup>th</sup> edition of the Fair, is a unique opportunity for the world's illustrators to present their works to the international community of publishers attending the Fair.

A great occasion for visibility that is not limited to the days of the exhibition and to the thousands of professionals at the Fair, but endures thanks to the ANNUAL, the catalogue that has become a reference tool for everyone in the children's publishing sector, accompanying every edition of the Illustrators Exhibition since 1971. Leafing through the Annuals from the last 43 years means tracing the history of children's illustration, seeing the trends and evolution of the world's art and the influence of various geographic and cultural areas.

There were thousands of candidates for this edition: 3,147 from 64 countries. The International Jury selected 77 illustrators from 22 countries (Brazil, Canada, China, Finland, France, Germany, Iran, Italy, Japan, Korea, Mongolia, Peru, Poland, Portugal, Russia, Slovakia, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Taiwan, Turkey, Ukraine, and the United States) whose panels give life to the Illustrators Exhibition and to the 2013 Annual.

**The 2013 International Jury** consists of experts in the field of publishing, illustration, and children's literature: Etienne Delessert, Illustratore (Switzerland) - Maria Grazia Mazzitelli, Salani editore (Italy) - Tàssies, Illustratore (Spain) - Gita Wolf, Tara Books (India) -JunkoYokota, Professor of Children's Literature (USA).

Excerpt from the Jury's report: "As jurors, what we found to be helpful was each other's ability to articulate why we liked something. By the same token, we recognized also that sometimes it is not easy to express why, but you just know you "hate" it or "love" it. We faced many hard decisions but we did so by taking care to articulate not only subjective reactions but also objective reasons for our reaction. We recognized the power of personal taste, yet respected what may not have been to our personal taste yet could still be an example of work that met the selection criteria. We distinguished those that were technically well executed from those that were not. In the end, we realized that taste is difficult to explain fully in any real objective sense. We sought works that intrigued us and made us wonder and want to know more about the story in the images....

We were confronted with a vast variety of styles. Some were graphic and very good; some were original in their style. The publishers among us wondered whether the works were publishable. But perhaps this is the wrong question to ask. The entries were not so much developed books as potential ones. Ultimately, however, knowing what great books can be, we sought the images that promised to become just that when publishers take the time to work with artists to fully develop their ideas into a finished book.....

We made an effort not to be elitist. Although sometimes decisions seemed to move very quickly, we still held on to the underlying meaning of the Bologna exhibition: to present and introduce works of the most promising illustrators whether already published or not....In conclusion, we found it very moving that so many young people are inspired to work in this artistic medium."

## 2013 ANNUAL

The cover artist of the 2013 Annual is PETER SÍS, winner of the 2012 Hans Christian Andersen Prize. Peter Sís was born in Bro, Moravia, and now lives in New York, where he works as an artist, writer, and director. He is an award-winning director of 26 films and animated shorts and creator of stage designs and murals.

Recipient of a MacArthur Fellowship in 2003, he has written and illustrated over 60 books for adults and children, including three Caldecott Honor books: STARRY MESSENGER – GALILEO GALILEI, TIBET THROUGH THE RED BOX, and THE WALL – Growing Up Behind the Iron Curtain. THE TREE OF LIFE – CHARLES DARWIN received the Gold Medal of the Society of Illustrators. THE THREE GOLDEN KEYS won the most prestigious awards in France, TIBET THROUGH THE RED BOX in Germany, and THE TREE OF LIFE and THE WALL in Italy. His works, which include three-dimensional works, have been exhibited in Europe, Asia and America, and have recently been presented at The Art Institute of Chicago and at the Mary Ryan Gallery in New York. His latest book,

THE CONFERENCE OF THE BIRDS, was published by Penguin Press in 2011.
